SUZUKI VISITS ALEXANDER GALT

On November 19, 1986, grades five and six of all the elementary schools in the district and Level I students from Galt gathered in our auditorium to hear a speech by Dr. David Suzuki.

Dr. Suzuki has not been a practicing scientist since 1979, but is still very interested in that field. He also made it very clear that there is not enough science around.

"Science is more important than economical issues," says Suzuki. "Yet there is nothing about it in the newspapers."

What is science? Reading and answering questions? That is only partly right. It is thinking very carefully about what you have just read and then thinking about the questions you did not understand, like: Why does it fly? Why does it live only a certain amount of time?, etc.

Dr. Suzuki also mentioned that by the year 2000, which is only fourteen years away, there will be more solutions to diseases, more drugs, and we will take most machines for granted. By that year we will have to make more decisions about science and technology; therefore, we must know more about it.



We are harming nature by polluting the air and by other means that are just as bad. In one hundred years, thirty percent of all plants and wildlife will be extinct. In two hundred years, eighty percent of all plants and wildlife will be extinct. Insects and bacteria are going to live the longest amount of time on earth.

"When you harm nature," quotes Dr. Suzuki, "nature harms you because you are nature. The world is full of excitement around you; never take that away."

After a few questions from the students, Dr. Suzuki left heading for Montreal and more talking.

The C64 Corner

Since Christmas is only a few days away and it's not too late to place your order with Santa, I thought that this would be a good time to outline the EXCELLENT software that is available for the C64. Every C64 computer owner who owns a printer realizes the importance of a good word processor. There are several outstanding ones on the market for about the same price; namely PaperClip and TRAITEX. Both these word processors will provide you with all the features you will ever need and at a reasonable price. A good word processor is a MUST if you own a printer! Perhaps one of the most exciting new pieces of software you could ask Santa for is GEOS. The title GEOS stands for Graphic Environment Operating System. This piece of software provides you with deskTop (uses icons for file organization and management), geoPaint (a full-featured colour graphics workshop - like the KoalaPad), and geoWrite (a word processor with 5 different fonts in various styles). GEOS should certainly be at the top of any C64 owner's list of computer software for Christmas. Chessmaster 2000 is a powerful chess program and offers a variety of levels as well as THREE-DIMENSIONAL boards and a host of other features. Other excellent C64 games are Hacker II: The Domsday Papers, The Toy Shop, and World Games.

The Bill also states that there will be no smoking whatsoever, wheresoever on public grounds as of January 1, 1988. The school board will provide support to all employees who request assistance in kicking the habit.

The Students' Council, the School Council and the School Committee have reached a temporary compromise on the "carbonated drinks" item. The issue was brought forth with reasons such as "Hyperactivity" and "decrease in Work Efficiency." The Students' Council argued that there is no conclusive proof on these points, and that even though there are very minor cases of this, they hardly affect the students. The question of coffee being available was also

mentioned. Though the question is still going through deliberation, the Students' Council feels that it is the students' democratic right to have carbonated drinks available, along with nutritional foods.

The Eurythmics Have Their Revenge

The latest album from the Eurythmics, entitled *Revenge*, is a collection of love ballads, songs of betrayal and upbeat, danceable tunes. It is their fifth record and surely one of their best.

The Eurythmics are comprised of Annie Lennox and David Stewart who are both of Scottish and English decent.

Their newest effort is different from what they have done in the past. Each of their records has an individual sound and *Revenge* is no exception. They have matured musically with songs such as *Missionary Man* which commences with a blistering harmonica solo by Jimmy Z. Stewart has said that he took Jimmy right off the plane, drove him to the studio and placed him in front of a microphone to play a song he had never before heard. The first thing he played is what you hear.

Highlights from this incredible album include *Thorn in my Side*, *Let's Go*, a whimsical, fun song, *A Little of You*, and *The Miracle of Love*, a beautiful, hopeful song in which Annie Lennox sings: "How many sorrows/do you try to hide/in a world of illusion/-that's covering your mind/I'll show you something good/when you open your heart/you can make a new start/when your crumbling world falls apart/the miracle of love/will take away your pain/when the miracle of love/comes your way again."

The album also includes the songs *When Tomorrow Comes*, *The Last Time*, *Take Your Pain Away*, and *In This Town*.

In the gentle, smooth song *I Remember You* that was recorded live at a party, Annie sings: "Well there's a coloured picture in my mind/of all the places that I've left behind/of broken windows where the wind blows through the shells of houses turned to ruin/oh we were so young/we didn't realize just what we'd one."

Revenge definitely demonstrates their sheer talent and exuberant personalities. After such big hits as *Sweet Dreams*, *Here Comes the Rain Again*, *Who's That Girl*, *Right By Your Side*, *Would I Lie To You*, *There Must Be An Angel*, and, recently, *Missionary Man*, the Eurythmics have established themselves on the music scene as a force to be reckoned with. Hopefully, they will continue to record such innovative albums such as *Revenge* for our musical enjoyment.

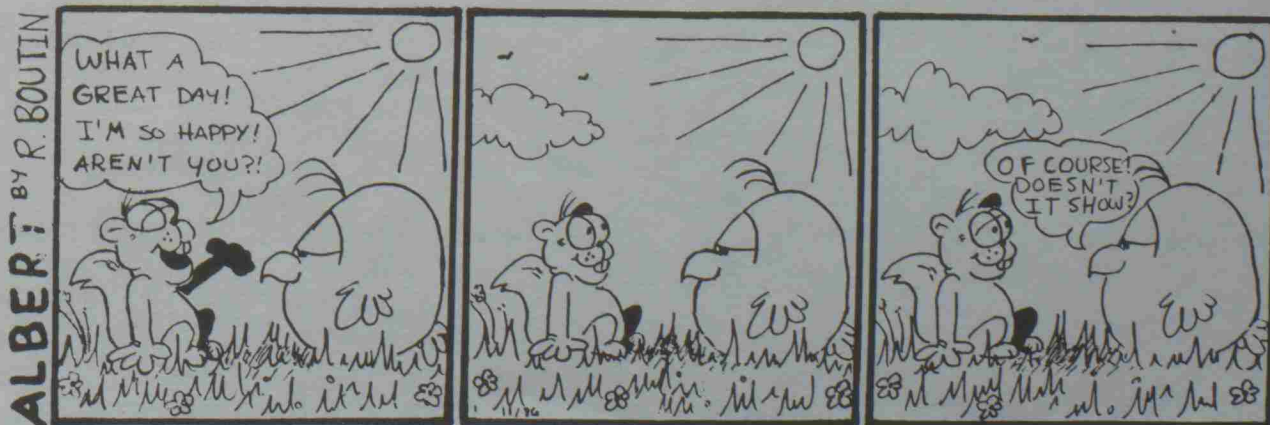
